Welcome, Meeting, Lecture – Everyone will be Muted

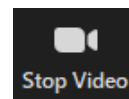
Questions – *Raise Hand* by clicking on *Participants* in the Zoom menu bar, then *Raise Hand* (the icon is a blue hand)

Show & Tell – Members show Asian art pieces (about 5 minutes each)

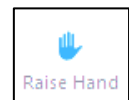
Discussion - Use *Unmute* to remain unmuted for the rest of the meeting

Taking a break? Please click on *Stop Video* when your video Square will be distracting (eating, moving around, sleeping). Leaving the meeting and re-entering distracts the speaker, but if leaving for good Press the red *Leave* button in the lower right hand corner above the Zoom menu bar.



Questions for the Speaker? The Speaker welcomes live questions at the end of the lecture. Everyone will be muted during the lecture. When you want to ask a question, use the *Raise Hand* button by clicking on *Participants* in the Zoom menu bar.
